Professional Development



Process of improving and increasing the capabilities of staff through access to education and training opportunities in the workplace, through outside organizations or through OJT. Helps build and maintain morale of staff members

Also helps individuals obtain the skills, qualifications, and experience that allow them to progress in their careers

Can reduce your exposure to risk and better prepare you to make informed decisions that encompass a larger scope



Nurses and Political Action

- Nurses, as individuals, frequently do not address political issues that affect the profession.
- A lack of knowledge of the legislative process causes them to be overwhelmed by the complexity of public policy.
- Nurses focus on clinical care and sometimes ignore larger issues, partially due to a heavy workload, but also due to a lack of understanding of how to influence public policy.





Advancing Health through Nursing Initiative on the Future of Nursing

Current Legislation (2/2)

- Some of the above states include the mandatory establishment of a comprehensive violence prevention program for health care employers, but over 40 states do not include this (NNA seal).
- According to a recent study in 2010, 36.6% of nurses experiencing workplace violence indicated that their employer does not have any type of workplace violence prevention training in place (Gillespie et al., 2010).
