

Working hand in hand with Harris Health Administration and program managers, the HCHD Foundation continues to diligently work to raise funds and awareness for the new programs that are aligned with Harris Health's Strategic plan: Population Health Management, which focuses on community health workers visiting patients' homes, promoting equity in breast cancer through navigation and education, and HealthConnect for remote blood pressure monitoring to high-risk pregnant patients. In addition, the new Greater Opportunity Alliance Learning accelerator (GOAL) program will expand opportunities for minority and women owned business enterprises (M/WBE) by providing technical assistance to enhance M/WBE's capacity to work with Harris Health and other contracting entities, fostering business growth and equal opportunity.





DEDICATED FUNDS FOR CHILDREN'S HEALTH ISSUES he HCHD Foundation Children's Health Fund is a permanent endowment established to support children's health issues in the Harris Health System and the Harris County community. Thank you to the Children's Health Advisory Committee members who donate their time and talent to research and approve grants for long-range health programs for children, between the ages of birth to 18 years. These children are not currently eligible for similar programs and are at the highest risk in our community.

Small Grants Fund

Through the HCHD Foundation's Small Grants Fund, the evolving partnership is on the move.

The HCHD Foundation is proud to have created the Small Grants Fund over ten years ago to be an example of how small funds can make a difference in the lives of others. Small funds don't always mean small impacts. Oftentimes, very small funds, when put in the hands of communitybased organizations like the Harris Health System, can achieve big results.

We continue to receive grant applications from employees of the Harris Health System and physicians of Baylor College of Medicine and UT Health Science Center for short-term innovative projects benefitting patients of the Harris Health System. These disciplines realize that innovation directly improves the patient's experience – when the patient stays healthy, or gets better quicker, they need less care.

On a monthly basis, the HCHD Foundation Small Grants Committee reviews applications for innovative pilot projects benefitting patients. These pilot projects have the opportunity to be granted up to \$5,000.00!

Since inception, HCHD Foundation Small Grants Committee has approved and granted funds in excess of \$464,650.00 to Harris Health System. For FYE 2023, the HCHD Foundation Small Grants Committee received one grant application and approved funds for this innovative project that would benefit patients totaling \$5,000.00. The project includes:

The primary focus of the Nursing Leadership Program is to continue to create opportunities or advanced education to those nurses who serve Harris Health patients.

The HCHD Foundation, in 2008, aligned with Harris Health System Administration to developed the Nursing Leadership Program to support professional growth and development and to award and recognize excellence in clinical practice. Throughout the year, funds are raised to support the Nursing Leadership Program to provide stipends for books, fees, and time-off pay to full-time nursing employees who are in the process of pursuing advance nursing degrees. Nursing professionals are also encourage to participate in nursing research initiatives. These initiatives are presented at local and national conferences, thus highlighting Harris Health System's high level of excellence in nursing care. The Nursing Leadership Program results continue to light the way to improve and change the lives of those in Harris County and the patients of Harris Health System.

Employee Disaster Relief Program

ver 22 years ago, the Employee Disaster Relief Fund was established to assist employees facing financial hardship during a personal crisis or a natural disaster. The Fund relies primarily on individual donations from employees, community, and support from the HCHD Foundation.

In FYE23, the Harris Health Employee Disaster Relief Committee reviewed applications from employees seeking assistance. At the request of Harris Health System, the HCHD Foundation processed and expedited 23 approved grants totaling \$49,055.00 through the Employee Disaster Relief Fund. Since the inception of this program and continued collaboration of the employees, \$681,661.00 have been awarded to the employees of Harris Health System during times of crisis.

A special thank you to the employees of Harris Health System for their continuing financial support of the Employee Disaster Relief Fund for demonstrating kindness towards your fellow coworkers, to the generosity of the HCHD Foundation friends, supporters, and partners. Supporting Harris Health System

he HCHD Foundation strives to make a difference in the lives of the patients that are served by the Harris Health System as well as the excellent doctors, nurses, and staff who care for these patients. In FY23, in addition to the programs listed to the right, the HCHD Foundation was excited to raise funds and awareness through our two signature events (see pages 6 & 8) for the Harris Health System School of Diagnostic Medical Imaging Program! The Harris Health System School of Diagnostic Medical Imaging Program offers medical radiology, medical sonography, graduate fellowship in computed tomography, and graduate fellowship in magnetic resonance imaging. These unique hospitalbased programs offer students the valuable opportunity to train using leading-edge medical technology in Ben Taub Hospital, one of only two level 1 trauma centers in Houston, and Lyndon B. Johnson Hospital, a level III trauma center.

The Harris Health System Radiology program has been awarded an 8-year accreditation award – the highest accreditation award presented by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT), whom promotes excellence in education and enhances quality and safety of patient care through the accreditation of education programs; such as, the School of Diagnostic Medical Imaging!

Did you know that an average daily census of 492 patients per day will utilized the services offered through this program?
